Bemidji, Minnesota 2011-2012 District Aims, Goals and Measures

AIM 1 Highest Levels of Student Success

Goal A Reading:

In Bemidji Area Schools district-wide the “All Students” group will increase their proficiency of 74.3% in the Spring of 2011 to 78% in the Spring of 2012 and to 82% in the Spring of 2013 as measured by the MCA-II in Reading.

Goal A1 In Bemidji Area Schools district-wide the Special Education subgroup will increase their proficiency of 34.9% in the Spring of 2011 to 40% in the Spring of 2012 and 45% in the Spring of 2013 as measured by the MCA-II in Reading.

Goal B Mathematics:

In Bemidji Area Schools district-wide, the “All Students” group will increase their proficiency of 54.9% in the Spring of 2011 to 65% in the Spring of 2012 and to 70% in the Spring of 2013 as measured by the MCA-III in Mathematics.

Goal B1 In Bemidji Area Schools district-wide the Special Education subgroup will increase their proficiency of 23.7% in the Spring of 2011 to 28% in the Spring of 2012 and 33% in the Spring of 2013 as measured by the MCA-III in Mathematics.

Goal C Graduation Rate:

The Bemidji High School student graduation rate as measured by MDE’s Five-Year Graduation Rate calculations will increase by 1% for all students in 2011-2012. (Baseline Data: Bemidji High School Five-Year Graduation Rate: 2009 = 89.5%, 2010 = 90.7%)

AIM 2 Safe and Welcoming Environment

Goal A Demonstrate Respect:

Bemidji Area Schools’ students will reduce the incidences of assaults and fights by 5% as reported by school principals on the Skyward Student Management Data System for 2011-2012. (Baseline Data: 2010-2011 Grades K-5 – 109; Grades 6-8 – 43; grades 9-12 – 23).

AIM 3 Effective and Efficient Operations

Goal A Efficient Use of Resources:

Bemidji Area Schools will continue to analyze school schedules during the 2011-2012 school year to determine the most efficient use of district resources including

time and talent. Recommendations will be submitted to the Bemidji School Board in April/May 2012.

Goal B

During 2011-2013, Bemidji Area Schools will participate in a statewide comprehensive review of teacher evaluation policies and practices, which reflect current best practices and research. A district teacher evaluation committee will make recommendations for changes to the Bemidji School Board by June 2013.
