

## FINANCE – PAYMENT OF FEES AND OTHER CHARGES

It is the policy of the Board of Education that the public school education provided shall be free and no pupil shall be denied an education because of economic inability to furnish educational books and supplies necessary for graduation.

The Board of Education has the right to make certain charges and establish fees in areas considered extracurricular, noncurricular or supplementary to the requirements for the successful completion of a required class or educational program.

The following fees will be required:

1. Admission fees or charges for extracurricular activities and concerts:

Admission Fees

Student Single Event	\$3.00
Adult Single Event	\$6.00
Student Concert Event	\$2.00
Adult Concert Event	\$5.00
Employee Pass	No Charge
Employee Guest Pass	\$40.00
10-Event Adult	\$40.00
10-Event Student	\$20.00
All Season Student	\$40.00
All Season Adult	\$70.00

NOTE: Each employee may purchase one Employee Guest Pass per year and it must be issued to a specified named individual.

Activity Fees:

High School:

- \$80.00 for an activity
- \$60.00 additional if participating in more than one activity
- \$70.00 fine arts and academic competition activities
- \$40.00 for each additional fine art and academic competition activities

Middle School:

- \$60.00 for an activity
- \$40.00 additional if participating in more than one activity

Family Maximum of \$400.00

Activity fees will be waived for students who are dependents of currently deployed military personnel.

2. Security Deposits for return of materials, supplies or equipment. Security deposits will be returned at the time the material, supplies or equipment is returned. Security deposits will not exceed the cost of the items being secured.
3. Field trips considered supplementary to a district education program. Fees are not to exceed actual cost.
4. Students will be required to furnish their own transportation to and from an instructional community based employment station which is part of an approved occupational experience secondary vocational program.
5. Charges for textbooks, workbooks, library books or other equipment or materials lost or destroyed. Fees will be based on replacement costs.
6. Fees will be charged for any program where the resultant product becomes the personal property of the student. This includes projects that are part of a class or program that is supplementary to the required classes and programs. Fee will not exceed actual cost.
7. Student parking fees for parking in student only designated parking lots as follows: \$30.00 per semester.
8. Actual cost of personal physical education and athletic equipment and apparel. A student may provide their own providing it meets reasonable health and safety requirements.
9. Costs for items of personal use such as student publications, class rings, annuals, graduation announcements and tassels are the student's responsibility.

The District may waive any fee or charge if any student or the student's parent or guardian is unable to pay it.
