Eighth Grade Painting and Drawing is a more in depth exploration of different painting and drawing methods and materials than what you received in 6th or 7th Grade Art. Heavy emphasis will be on learning about the qualities and methods of each material, speaking about art, and using the elements and principles of design and art history influences in your art making! You will create scratch art animals, contour line drawings of your hand with an object, kaleidoscope acrylic paintings, graphite "selfies", illuminated letters, blackout poetry pieces, trompe l'oeils, and more!

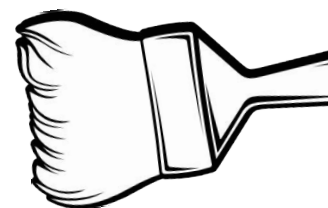

What Can You Expect?

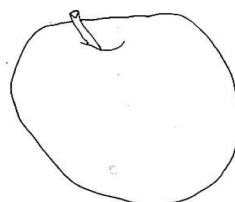
- You will be busy every day!
