In February, students will have the opportunity to take the OLPA(Optional Local Purpose Assessment). OLPA is available in mathematics and reading for students in grades 3-8. It provides a risk-free environment for students to familiarize themselves with online testing and provides teachers with information to target instruction before the spring tests used for accountability. Online samplers in math, reading, and science are also available to help students prepare for the MCA's (Minnesota Comprehension Assessment) given this spring. This is a very important time of the year for students to focus on academic achievement. As always, our staff is very dedicated to encouraging students to do their very best. Our school is fortunate to have

parents and families who also support our efforts in high achievement.

Dear Parents,

I hope that everyone had a great holiday season! It's very nice to be back in the swing of things here at school. The kids have really been working hard on their stuff!

In math, the 2nd graders will be learning how to add and subtract larger numbers. Each child is working on learning the math facts. This includes addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Doing flashcards or verbally quizzing them on the facts will really help them. If they automatically know the answers, it will be much easier for your child to figure out more difficult equations.



Another bright spot in our room is Accelerated Reader. The kids in this class have read and passed the test on 2,191 books so far this year and are averaging 90%! The only way to become a better reader is to practice. Our library day is Thursday, so please be sure your child has their library book that day. The children may also check out books any time they need to. Along with the regular reading lesson, we're also doing guided reading groups and AR. You can help your child by making sure you also read with them EVERY day.

The kids are also learning about different types of writing. We've been working on writing to persuade and will be working on writing to inform. We also spend time reading different genres everyday and learning what genre a story belongs to.

Thank you so much for all the work you do at home with you kids! This class is just awesome at

learning new things, being kind to each other, and fun to be around!

MRS. JOHNSON'S 4th & 5TH GRADE

FOURTH GRADE NEWS

When we teach reading, we are teaching a skill – like playing the piano or swimming. And when we teach skills, the student needs to be doing the thing. That is, there is very little I can do from the front of my classroom that will make you good at playing the piano or swimming. Students need to be playing

the piano or swimming. And in a similar way, my students need to be reading – practice makes better.

Although it is common sense that students need to read a lot to learn to read well, this is also the one single conclusion that is most supported by reading research. Krashen (2004) showed that 93% of the tests on reading comprehension that collect data on volume of reading show that kids who are given more time to read do better. The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) shows that at every grade, reading more pages at home and at school was associated with higher reading scores (U.S. Department of Education, 1999).

Students in my classroom are provided a minimum of 30 minutes of independent reading each day. In addition, I require students to read at least 15 minutes as part of their daily homework. I provide students a reading log to record their reading in school and at home along with a parent sign-off sheet to confirm the reading and other homework has been completed. I appreciate the time and effort parents commit to helping their children complete their reading practice. The more children read, the better readers they become.

Responsive Classroom Corner

This month all of the classroom teachers are putting an extra focus on following directions. Each week we will put some tips on how you can practice with your child at home to become better direction followers.

If the child is not following daily sequencing routines or directions, help create a visual routine (i.e. job chart, sticker chart) focusing in on a specific item and keeping that routine in the same order of first, second, third, last, etc. This child may have trouble with a general direction such as clean up. The directive may need to be broken down into smaller and more direct instructions such as put your toys in the box and your books on the shelf rather than clean your room.


Happy New Year! We wish you a wonderful 2017.
