## What's new in 2016-2017 State Testing?

- ➤ 2017 is the final year for the Optional Local Purpose Assessment (OLPA)
- New Every Student Succeeds (ESSA) law: Policies will be determined during 2017-2018 school year, schools not making progress will be identified based on the 2018 MCA results, and beginning 2018-2019 MDE will provide support for schools not making progress.
- ➤ April 10-21, 2017, is the Accountability Window when students must test and will count for Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) Participation and Proficiency. This window is also used for ACCESS for the first time.

#### ➤ New Test Codes:

- Parent Refusal (REF-P): The parent must make this request in writing using the new Parent Refusal form provided by MDE. Send this form to Jacque and keep this on file for two years. This will count against the school and district for Participation, but not Proficiency.
- Student Refusal (REF-S): This is new. If a student refuses to test, this is no longer indicated as an invalidation. This will count against the school and district for Participation, but not Proficiency.
- Decline (DEC): Used <u>only</u> for ACCESS assessments when students refuse to test.
  Must keep documentation on file for two years.
- o Invalidate Student (INV-S): Indicated if a student engages in inappropriate activity or behavior before, during, or after testing that affects the validity of the test.
- Invalidate Device (INV-D): Indicated when a student accesses a cell phone or other device at any point during test administration (including breaks and when testing is completed), even if the student did not use it.
- o Invalidate Other (INV-O): Indicated for misadministration or other situations, including staff actions, which compromise the validity of test results.
- ➤ Test Administration Changes: These are now noted in the Test Monitor Directions, which are longer and include a table of contents.
  - o Reading MCA sections and number of passages updated
  - o 5-8 MCA Math total estimated test administration times increased
  - MTAS estimated test administration times determined

#### ➤ TestNav Availability:

- Student Tests: 6:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m. weekdays only
- Data Entry: 6:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m. weekdays only
- ➤ The Math Audio CD accommodation is no longer available



- ➤ Keep all documentation for two years.
- ➤ For Online Test Monitor training, there are now two Online Test Monitor Certification videos including: an 18 minute video that includes Active Monitoring and online test setup, and an 8 minute video that includes Active Monitoring only.
- For MTAS training, there are now two Courses.
  - Teachers experienced in administering the MTAS can complete the course for MTAS Scoring. Look at the left side under Courses to select Experienced Test Administrators.
  - New teachers need to complete three modules: MTAS Overview, MTAS Test Administration, and MTAS Scoring. Look at the left side under Courses to select New Test Administrators.
- ➤ You can now print test session student rosters
- You can now lock student tests when they are exited. Students cannot test unless the tests are resumed. This is not required but offered as an additional security option.
- ➤ Watch for any wearable technology. No technology that is capable of sending or receiving information or taking photos is allowed during or after testing, not even for the test monitor.
- ➤ Test monitors no longer have to record on the Test Administration Report when the Data Entry for accommodated testing is completed. The state has access to this information online.
- ➤ MDE will continue to monitor schools during testing. All school testing calendars must be posted on the district web site.
- > Finalized Reporting Dates:
  - o May 22 June Posttest Editing in Test WES send names of students with Significant Gap (15 or more consecutive days of absence) to Jacque
  - June 7 Last day to update MARSS data for accountability make sure all students are listed at the correct grade level
  - June 26 Retrieve embargoed final reading, math, and science District Student Results (DSR) and School Student Results (SSR) files on Assessment Secure Reports – Jacque will upload these to Viewpoint
  - July 24 Retrieve embargoed final math, reading, and science school and district summary results in Assessment Secure Reports
  - July 26 Media receives embargoed final assessment results for school and district
  - o July 26 Access Published and Longitudinal Reports on PearsonAccess Next
  - o July 27 Public release of final assessment results in Data Center
  - o July 31 Student reports (including DVD) arrive in district
