- Amanda Mix, RtI Math/Science Specialist, is hired through Title II and she will continue providing support for math and science standards and curriculum and Viewpoint.
- **Brigitta** (Gigi) Nicoson, RtI Reading/Social Studies Specialist, is hired through Title II and replacing Karie Hougard. She will provide support for language arts and social studies standards and curriculum.

# > October 2, 2017 Staff Development Day:

The focus of this day is School Improvement. The principals will take charge in the activities for their staff and may invite other presenters to come in such as the above specialists, Q-Comp coordinators (Terry Hewitt and Erin Curran), or ALICE trainers. At the end of the day, time is allowed for teachers to participate in their PLCs.

#### > Title I Professional Development Activities:

Title I received a \$50,000 cut in allocation for 2017-2018, so we cut back on the district Title I expenses to allow more at the building level. Title I, Part A is supporting the required training for the Title I Minnesota Reading Core coaches and Reading Recovery teachers.

# > Title II Professional Development Activities:

Title II received a \$100,000 cut in allocation for 2017-2018. We are watching what the federal government will do because the Trump administration wants to eliminate Title II. Several congressmen disagree, so it will be interesting to see what happens. Title II supports professional development for the nonpublic schools and our district. The main district focus is supporting the two RtI Specialists, .75 of an FTE teacher for Class Size Reduction, and the facilitator and supplies for the August 23, 2017 District Data Retreat
