

STUDENT PERSONNEL
ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Participation in extra-curricular activities is a privilege granted to a student, it is not an inherent student right. It is the belief of the Board of Education that such participation must be earned based on academic performance.

To be scholastically eligible for any extra-curricular activity, a student must maintain a minimum of a 2.0 cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA). The minimum requirement of a 2.0 cumulative GPA will be put into effect following the conclusion of the second term of a student's freshman year. Scholastic eligibility will be determined at the end of each term. Students forfeit their eligibility for one term in which they attend school if they do not maintain a minimum Grade Point Average of 2.0 cumulative. All grades from alternative programs will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility.

Students and parent/guardian may apply for a contractual agreement with the Activities Coordinator in an effort to become scholastically eligible. This agreement includes sustained progress towards meeting the high school graduation requirements while maintaining or making consistent progress toward a 2.0 GPA for a minimum of one term before eligibility is granted. Student will remain on a probationary status until a 2.0 cumulative GPA is reached.

Students will become subject to this policy upon entering high school.
