## What is a Schoolwide Title 1 Program?

J. W. Smith Elementary is considered a Title 1 Schoolwide Program. A Title 1 Schoolwide program is a method of delivering Title 1 services in eligible schools. It allows the school to address the educational needs of children with comprehensive strategies so that every student achieves high levels of academic proficiency.

### Who are Title 1 students?

All students are considered Title 1 students and receive the benefits of Title 1 services. In addition, some students are identified as more focused intervention based on assessments and classroom performance.

## How are children provided with Title 1 services?

Children are provided with Title 1 services using the push-in model, where the Title 1 staff will work with the children in the classroom or a pull-out model, where small groups of children are brought to a designated Title 1 classroom.

## How are children assessed in a Schoolwide Title 1 program?

Children are assessed using various district and school assessments:

- MCA (Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment Reading and Math)
- MAP (Measures of Academic Progress Reading and Math)
- FastBridge Benchmarking (Reading and Math)
- Progress Monitoring (LLI, Number Words, FastBridge, diagnostics, etc.)

# How are parents involved?

- Parents are notified about the school's Title 1 program on the building website.
- Parents are invited to participate in reading and math activities throughout the school year.
- Parents are provided information about Title 1 through parent/teacher conferences, through the Parent Involvement Plan and on the building's website.

# What can parents do?

- Share a love of learning and set a good example by reading, writing letters or lists, comparing prices, etc.
- Make learning fun by playing educational games, visiting the library, and listening to and talking with your child.
- Show interest in your child's school day by asking specific questions and praising effort and improvements.
