

<u>SOLWAY'S PRINCIPAL'S</u> <u>CORNER</u>

Tuesday, December 18 at 1:15 is the **Winter Holiday Music Concert**. We are excited for our students to entertain all of you with their musical talents.

Winter Break begins December 24, 2018 and school will resume on January 2, 2019.

We are expecting weather to start getting

colder!! With the onset of this cold weather, I want to remind parents of the policy for outside wear. All students are expected to wear a winter coat, snow pants, boots, a hat, and gloves/mittens. Students are required to go outside for recess if the temperature and wind chill is -5 degrees or warmer. They could get cold very easily if they are not dressed properly. Please be sure that your child is dressed appropriately. Scholarships may be available if you cannot afford these items.

Winter weather also brings the possibility of **Emergency School Closings**. It is very important to have emergency plans for days when school is cancelled, has a late start, or is dismissed early.

Please listen to your local radio station or TV station if the weather conditions are questionable. Announcements are relayed to parents through these means. Discuss your emergency plans with your children so they know what to do when weather requires a change in the school schedule. Our phones get very busy during those times, so I encourage parents to make arrangements ahead of time. If you child attends Kids and Company, please be familiar with their policies on school closings. If school is let out early, Kids and Company is canceled. If evening activities only are canceled, Kids and Company closes at 4:00.



Vocabulary plays an important part in learning to read. Beginning readers must use the words they hear orally to make sense of the words they see in print. Kids who hear more words spoken at home learn more words and enter school with better vocabularies. This larger vocabulary pays off exponentially as a child progresses through school.

Consider, for example, what happens when a beginning reader comes to the word *dig* in a book. As she begins to figure out the sounds represented by the letters d, i, g, the reader recognizes that the sounds make up a very familiar word that she has heard and said many times. It is harder for a beginning reader to figure out words that are not already part of their speaking (oral) vocabulary.

Vocabulary also is very important to reading comprehension. Readers cannot understand what they are reading without knowing what most of the words mean. As children learn to read more

advanced texts, they must learn the meaning of new words that are not part of their oral vocabulary.

I am attaching information about how parents and families can help students with vocabulary development.




MRS. SHERWOOD'S & MRS. JOHNSON'S FIRST GRADE



Parents may come into the library and we will create a community member account for you. You may check out extra books for your child or yourself this way. We love to share our books and resources!




The Scholastic Wild West Book Fair: "Saddle Up and Read!"

Hour Of Code is coming to the Solway Technology Lab during Computer Science Education Week from

21st century critical thinking and problem solving skills. Our students will be participating in events during the school day to give everyone an exciting introduction to Computer Science.

We believe that learning computer programming gives kids important skills to navigate a future where many aspects of their lives will be influenced by technology. Giving them the confidence to understand how technology works and the ability to control it, is an increasingly important part of children's education today, and we are getting started with an Hour of Code.



Solway School wants all students to experience how easy and empowering it is to learn programming. The entire school will participate in an Hour of Code using a variety o fun and engaging activities from Tynker, a company that allows students to create and share projects with code, whil supporting Common Core and CSTA standards. Tynker's internationally recognized creative computing platform helps children of all ages develop computational thinking and programming skills as they snap together visual code blocks to create computer programs.

Younger students will focus on solving simple coding puzzles, and will use what they learn to create interactive holiday cards, cartoon comics, simple games and stories. Older students will be able to choose from a variety of coding projects from Tynker that will guide them through the creation of drawing tools, math art, and even multi-leve and multi-player games that they can share and play with each other. All week long, students will engage in fun, December 3-7 and beyond. The annual global campaign is collaborative activities and, best of all, they will learn key an effort to ensure all students are equipped with valuable programming concepts that Solway School will build on in the future

More Computer Lab News:

We are using a new keyboarding site in grade 3 called Typing Club. Students may access this from school or home at this address: https://solway-elementary.typingclub.com/ They sign in with their Accelerated Reader **Username and Password.** What is TypingClub? TypingClub is an educational platform for keyboarding. It is webbased and fully customizable, so your students can practice in class, at home, or wherever an internet connection can be found. Students are already familiar with the layout of the program because the design is very similar to popular games. Each lesson provides instant, meaningful feedback that encourages students to continue practicing.



Why Teach Keyboarding? Typing faster is not the primary objective of keyboarding; rather it is a desired side effect. Once your students are able to type with all ten fingers without needing to look down at the keyboard, their overall productivity when using a computer will improve dramatically. When typing with two fingers, the visual and frontal cortices of the brain are forced to focus on where individual keys are located. Keyboarding removes this burden, enabling students to work on things like sentence structure and grammar while they type. To help students in the classroom, the best thing you can do is to make sure students are not looking at the keyboard.

Do you have Internet access and a computer at home? If so, our school district has purchased software that our students can use at school *and at home*. We have purchased the World Book Online Encyclopedia! There are 3 different encyclopedias to use depending on the age of your child. The Kids Encyclopedia is for grades K-4, the Student Encyclopedia is for the upper elementary and middle school grades 5-9, and then the Advanced Encyclopedia for grades 9-12. You may access this encyclopedia by going to <u>http://www.worldbookonline.com</u>. The user name

is **bemidji** and the password is **waterway**. This is a wonderful resource for our students and their families!

Tumble Books: eBooks for eKids!

This site is an online collection of animated, talking picture books which teach young children the joys of reading in a format they'll love. The site is available for school *and home use*.
