This Month in reading and language arts, we are learning a lot about informational text and the world that we live in. 2nd graders recently learned what a biography is and why authors write them. We are diving into different parts of nature that we hope to gain new knowledge on, as well as things that happened many years ago. We are also learning a lot about taking our time and checking our work with what we have been reading. One of our goals as a class has been to be able to go back and find the answer to any question we may have in the story without having to guess. We also continue to work hard on quarterly reading goals, to help boost our fluency and stamina.

In math this month we are going to be exploring the features of new shapes and the funny terms that come with them! Your student will learn lots and lots about polygons, perimeter, area, rhombus', and much more! We also continue to work a lot in math with our math facts and fact families. Second graders will continue to build their skills on reading an analog clock, while the third graders will learn how to add and subtract elapsed time. Help us boost this skill

Thank you for making the bookfair such a success! We earned over \$1,200 as a library fundraiser.


Parents may come into the library and we will create a community member account for you. You may check out extra books for your child or yourself this way. We love to share our books and resources!

#### More Computer Lab News:

We are using a new keyboarding site in grade 3 called Typing Club. Students may access this from school or home at this address: https://solway-elementary.typingclub.com/ They sign in with their Accelerated Reader **Username and Password.** What is TypingClub? TypingClub is an educational platform for keyboarding. It is web-based and fully customizable, so your students can practice in class, at home, or wherever an internet connection can be found. Students are already familiar with the layout of the program because the design is very similar to popular games. Each lesson provides instant, meaningful feedback that encourages students to continue practicing.

Why Teach Keyboarding? Typing faster is not the primary objective of keyboarding; rather it is a desired side effect. Once your students are able to type with all ten fingers without needing to look down at the keyboard, their overall productivity when using a computer will improve dramatically. When typing with two fingers, the visual and frontal cortices of the brain are forced to focus on where individual keys are located. Keyboarding removes this burden, enabling students to work on things like sentence structure and grammar while they type. To help students in the classroom, the best thing you can do is to make sure students are not looking at the keyboard.
