Bemidji Area Schools 2013-2014 Improvement Plans

The Bemidji School Board approved the 2013-2014 proposals and will consider next year's proposals after analyzing the effectiveness of these measures.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS:

- 1. **Math Specialists**: Hire four full time and three half time Math Specialists to observe, coach, model lessons, collaborate on lesson planning, and provide small and large group professional development
- 2. Math Instruction Time: Increase math instruction time from 60 minutes to 90 minutes

MIDDLE SCHOOL:

1. MCA Math Preparation Courses for Grades 6, 7 & 8: Hire three current math teachers for overload positions to provide MCA Prep instruction for 15 students each using Khan Academy, Study Island, and Learning Point Navigator

For Consideration Next Year:

- 2. Scholastic Math 180: Purchase Scholastic Math 180 for 36 7th and 8th grade students as a pre-algebra intervention
- 3. **Math/Reading Tutors**: Hire two instructional paraprofessionals to provide reading and math tutoring for 60 grade 6-8 students each day

HIGH SCHOOL:

- 1. **Reading MCA Prep Course**: Hire a teacher to teach MCA Reading Prep for 16 grade 10 students second semester
- 2. Science/Math MCA Prep Course: Hire a teacher to teach MCA Science/Math Prep for 16 students second semester
- 3. **National Honor Society Tutoring**: NHS members will volunteer their time to tutor students in grades 9-12 in a variety of subjects Tuesdays and Thursdays during the four lunch periods

For Consideration Next Year:

4. **Special Education Attendance Incentive**: Provide special education students incentives for no unexcused absences with pop/food, 20 gift cards, and four Netbooks
