We are working to prepare for the school closure from <u>March 18th- March 27th</u>. In accordance with Executive Order 20-01 issued by Governor Walz, the District will provide childcare services for children <u>ages 12 and under</u> of <u>Emergency Workers</u>.

Our schools will provide childcare for eligible children of Emergency Workers from 7:30 am to 6:00 pm. An Emergency Worker includes:

- □ Health care providers and systems, including hospitals and clinics
- Dest-acute and long-term care facilities, including nursing and assisted-living facilities
- □ Other health systems and organizations, such as:
